**Councilwoman Woodruff**- Nothing toad at this time except Merry Christmas and wanting to hear the Attending citizens' concerns,

Councilman Stalker- Asked if the Town Trucks had been placarded yet. Supervisor Napoli stated that the Town name was on the license plate. Councilman Stalker then stated that he read in the paper that one of the Town's had taken the Town truck away from the Highway Superintendent, and it was available to him only while at work, for misuse of the Town truck. Supervisor Napoli said John does not misuse the truck to which Councilman Stalker stated that the taxpayers paid for the truck and it should have a placard.

The Supervisor asked for a motion to pay the bills as presented. Councilman Toussaint made the motion. Councilman Stalker seconded and the motion to pay the bills was carried.

At this time the Supervisor asked if there were any questions or concerns stating that he realized that the majority of the audience was from the Town of Knowlesville.

Bethany Clark a resident of the Town of Knowlesville asked the question "If the House is placarded why are the people still there?"

at which time Dan Wolfe the Code enforcement Officer for the Town of Ridgeway stated he does not have the authority to remove the people if the landlord has given them permission to live there. The site at 3634 Knowlesville Rd. was the scene of a standoff that started at 4:46 p.m. on Dec. 3 and continued until about 3 a.m. Dec. 4.

Residents say the site is a concern in the neighborhood, due to many people coming and going, people fighting at the house, shooting air rifles and alleged criminal activity.

Dan Wolfe, the town code enforcement officer, said the 2,211-square-foot house is zoned for single family, but has been used as boarding house with multiple tenants. That is against the town code for that zoning.

"I'm citing him for operating a boarding house," Wolfe told town residents "We'll do whatever we can to hold his feet to the fire."

Undersheriff Chris Bourke says the Sheriff's office will track down the owner of the property and serve him as the papers from the town. Registered mail to the owner has been returned to Ridgeway Town Hall unopened,

Undersheriff Chris Bourke said the Sheriff's Office can locate Rodgers and serve him with a letter from the town. Town Attorney Kathy Bogan told the residents she is also working with the District Attorney's office about addressing concerns from the residents.

"We have to go through the court process," she said. "We don't have a choice." Bogan said she will work to get the court process started, seeking relief for residents in the neighborhood.

Councilwoman Woodruff asked "How will we keep the residents informed of our progress?" Attorney Bogan stated that she will give the Board progress reports. The residents then presented the board with a petition with about 85 signatures from Knowlesville residents on a petition turned into the Town Board, asking for the boarding house to be shut down. Then as there were no further questions the supervisor asked for a motion to adjourn. Councilman Stalker made the motion. Seconded by Councilman Toussaint and the meeting was adjourned at 8:10P.M.
