They are also busy trimming trees, reading water meters, and will be doing water shut offs for nonpayment next week.

**Code Enforcement Officer:** CEO Raduns said he has issued two building permits, closed out two building permits, had one complaint, sent out six violations letters, and had one dispatch call for Ridgeway and covered one for the Town of Gaines.

**Town Attorney:** Attorney Bogan spoke about a request from CEO Raduns to amend Local Law #4 from 2006, which provided for the administration and enforcement of the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code. She explained the process in updating this Local Law, which includes being sent to the Planning Board for recommendations and the County Planning Board for comments.

Councilwoman Woodruff: Councilwoman Woodruff asked Councilman Toussaint how the meeting for the summer parks program went. He explained that he attended a meeting with the Health Department about whether the program was a day camp or a drop-in program, the main difference being the type of activities involved.
