B. Department and County Legislator Reports:

Town Clerk: Town Clerk Hill said that taxes are still trickling in. With the warmer weather, people were starting to come in for fishing licenses. She updated the Board on DEC changes to paper licenses this summer. She also said that she has had many requests lately for very old marriage certificates. People have been using them to prove lineage and apply for dual citizenship in Italy.

Assessor: Assessor Cecchini's report was read by Supervisor Napoli in her absence. Exemptions that were due March 1 have been processed, and she is up to date on building permits and transfers.

Code Enforcement Officer: CEO Raduns said he has closed out three building permits, continues working on local law updates, inspections, state training. He said he talked to the Civil Service office today and they still did not have results from his test.

Highway Superintendent: Superintendent Olinger said that they are still doing some salting, lawn repair, reading water meters, and some ditching. He said roadwork will begin in a couple of weeks. He also said that the Town Hall sign is currently at Takeform getting freshened up.

Village of Medina: Trustee Marciano said the Village followed suit with the senior and disabled tax exemptions, mirroring the rest of the County. She reminded everyone about the Village election taking place March 19.

Town of Ridgeway Local Law #1 of 2024 Entitled:

A local law to amend the Town of Ridgeway Zoning Ordinance to add the following:

Add to the Definition Section:

OUTDOOR DISPLAY AREA: land that is used to show, exhibit or make visible products, goods or equipment for the purpose of sale or promotion, requiring a Special Use Permit.

OUTDOOR DISPLAY: Merchandise that is sold for retail to be displayed outdoors subject to review and approval of the Planning Board where applicable.

Add the following new section:

SECTION 754 ACCESSORY STRUCTURES, UTILITY SHEDS OR THE OUTDOOR DISPLAY OF GOODS FOR SALE

The Planning Board may approve a special use permit for the sales of Accessory Structures, Utility Sheds or the Display of Outdoor Goods for sale in the General Business (GB) District provided that the following standards and provisions are maintained:

A. Minimum Specifications for:

Front Setback	25 feet
Side Setback	20 feet
Rear Setback	20 feet

Setback From Principal

Structures 10 feet
Lot frontage 200 feet
Lot size One (1) acre
Maximum Bldg, Coverage 50%

Maximum Bldg. Coverage 50% Minimum Green Space 20%

Front setbacks are to be measured from the right-of-way. If measured from the center of the roadway, add 50 feet for State highways, 40 feet for County highways, and 30 feet for Town roads.

- B. No Structure shall be placed within any right of way or restrict any Fire Apparatus Access-way or within 15ft. of a Fire Hydrant.
- C. Entrance and exit driveways shall have a minimum width of 25 feet and shall be not less than 20 feet from any side property line. A minimum distance of 50 feet shall be maintained between driveways.

- D. All Structures and goods shall be displayed in a neat and orderly manner and maintained to provide an un objectionable appearance that is in harmony with its surrounding.
- E. The entire surface of the site to be traveled by motor vehicles shall be hard surfaced and maintained accordingly. Adequate parking shall be provided.
- F. All signs must comply with Section 600 of the Town of Ridgeway Zoning Regulations.
- G. No exterior light source shall be erected in excess of 50 foot above ground surface and all lighting shall be placed to eliminate the casting of direct light or glare upon the adjacent property and highway.
- H. All structures or goods on display shall be adequately anchored with the appropriate temporary anchoring methods needed to provide wind protection.
- I. Any drive thru display areas shall be off limits to the public by an approved method, between the hours of 9 pm. and 7 am.
- J. All Structures on display must comply with all applicable New York State Building Codes.
- K. This section does not include Structures intended to be used as a dwelling, cottage, or similar. This section is not for the sale of used goods, the definition "Yard Sale" shall be used for that purpose. This section shall also not apply to farm produce stands or seasonal roadside stands.
- L. Residential properties shall be screened from view as required by the Planning Board.
